6a. 13-0334 Neighborhood Pathways Program

The committee recommends the following projects be forwarded to Council for funding approval:

Scammell Avenue, NW - pursue easements
Puget Street, NE - sharrows to be discussed at a later date
Woodard Avenue, NW

The committee would like staff to continue to explore:

16th Avenue, NE, alignment - ok to spend program money on this Central and Miller, NE - have a conversation with staff on findings and report back at next BPAC

In addition, the committee asked that staff explore CFP funding ideas for the 26th Avenue, NE, project. Staff to meet with the Neighborhood Association to discuss/brainstorm ideas. Staff will then present predesign cost to BPAC.

The committee also provided the following comments:

Timeline was too short.

No substantive information was shared with BPAC on projects.

Projects were more complex than expected.

More information and review at preliminary state of applications.

Bring other staff into review to understand environmental permitting issues early.

More guidance to neighborhoods for the application process - ask about streams, slopes,

Need more neighborhood associations involved.

Create a neighborhood and staff planning team - be more collaborative.

Projects were recommended for funding approval and referred to the City Council.
