OVERVIEW OF THE CDBG PROGRAM

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program was created as a "bundled" federal aid program intended to aid, "... the development of viable urban communities, by providing decent housing and a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate income ..." (Taken from the Housing and Urban Development website). The program was designed with flexibility to allow communities to determine how to meet the specific local needs of low-moderate income individuals. (Additional information can be found at www.HUD.gov or Part 24 CFR parts 500 - 600.)

ELIGIBLE CDBG-FUNDED ACTIVITIES

Acquisition of Real Property (Typically land acquisition for development of affordable housing, community centers or economic development)

Disposition (costs of disposing of real property)

Public Facilities and Improvements (*Public community centers, sidewalks, sewers, water systems*)

Clearance (*Removal of urban blight, environmental clean-up*)

Public Services (Social services for non-profits to assist low income people)

Interim Assistance (Immediate actions needed to arrest deterioration or other emergency conditions)

Relocation (Costs of relocated displaced tenants from rehabilitation projects)

Loss of Rental Income 2-35

Privately-Owned Utilities 2-3

Rehabilitation (Renovation of existing housing, both tenant and owner occupied)

Construction of Housing (New construction ONLY by certified Community Based Development Organizations or CBDO's)

Code Enforcement (Enforcing codes to clean up low & moderate income neighborhoods)

Special Economic Development Activities (Activities that sustain or retain business)

Microenterprise Assistance (*Training & other help for small businesses*)

Special Activities by CBDO's (See above)

Homeownership Assistance (Down payment assistance, homeowner counseling)

Planning and Capacity Building (Costs of developing community development plans)

Program Administration Costs (Costs of running the CDBG program – subject to a 20% cap)
