

Traffic Box Wrap Project

Olympia's Traffic Box Wrap project turns traffic boxes found on sidewalks & street corners into a collection of public art pieces. The wraps not only beautify our City but greatly reduce the amount of graffiti on the boxes and the maintenance hours required to clean them.

As part of the project, community members are invited to submit their work to be considered for a public vote. The top ten images with the most votes are printed as vinyl canvases and installed on traffic boxes around town.

The project started in 2015 and there are currently 72 traffic box wraps on display throughout the City.
