5. PUBLIC HEARING

5.A Public Hearing - The Extension of the Moratorium on Marijuana Establishments

Code Enforcement Officer Chris Grabowski reviewed the issue. He noted this six month extension will not get us through to the July 1 date, but extensions can only be done in six month increments. He said the Liquor and Cannabis Board timeline is to have its rules in place by the end of December. Mr. Grabowski then explained the change from collective gardens to cooperative gardens.

The public hearing was opened at 7:35 p.m. No one spoke and the public hearing was closed.

Councilmember Cooper moved, seconded by Councilmember Hankins, to approve the ordinance extending the moratorium on medical marijuana collective gardens and other cannabis-related uses not licensed by Washington State for an additional six months on first reading and forward to second reading.
