PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE: A quick guide for the BPAC

Guiding Principles

Every member has an equal voice. The group is the final authority. It's ok to disagree.

DISCUSSIONS

- No one speaks twice until everyone has had a chance to speak
- Members must be recognized by chair before speaking
- Members address the chair, not each other

MOTIONS

- Anyone can make a motion at any time after the chair has recognized them to speak
 - Chair repeats the motion
- Anyone can second the motion don't need to wait for chair's recognition
 - If no second, motion doesn't proceed
- Motion gets discussed, if needed
- Motion can be amended
 - Chair repeats motion with amendment

VOTING

- When discussion wanes...
- Chair clearly states motion and any amendments
- Vote
 - "All in favor, say aye"
 - "All opposed, say no"
- Chair states results of vote
 - "The ayes have it and the motion passes"
 - "The noes have it and the motion fails"
