2. SPECIAL RECOGNITION

2.A 16-1134 Special Recognition - State Auditor's Stewardship Award

Director of Local Audit Kelly Collins and Auditor Bryson Bristol presented the City of Olympia with the Washington State Auditor's Office Stewardship Award (SASA). The State Auditors Stewardship Awards are presented in recognition of outstanding accomplishment in the stewardship of public resources as we pursue the shared goal of government that works better, costs less and earns greater public trust.

- 6. OTHER BUSINESS
- **6.A** 16-0808 Briefing on Complete Streets Funding Study (Multimodal Concurrency)

Senior Planner Sophie Stimson briefed the Council on the Multimodal Concurrency program. Ms. Stimson took a moment to remember Jerry Parker, who recently passed away. Mr. Parker had a strong interest in making Olympia a more multimodal city and worked on the project as a citizen advisor and a member of the working group.

Ms. Stimson gave a brief overview of concurrency, which is a requirement of the Washington State Growth Management act. It requires the City's transportation infrastructure must be built at the same time of or "concurrent" with new development.

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She discussed how concurrency is currently addressed and the yearly concurrency analysis.

Ms. Stimson discussed why there is a focus on multimodal transportation, in particular to address the needs of the 20,000 people who are projected to move to Olympia in the next 20 years. She reviewed what will be different about the multimodal concurrency program and the working group during the scoping process. She also reviewed measures and how system completeness works.

Director of Transportation Mark Russell discussed the development of a Transportation Master Plan. It is anticipated this will take approximately 3 years.

Don Samdahl of Fehr and Peers discussed the topic and highlighted the framework staff and the committee has put together, noting how it will help the City implement the program in a thoughtful manner.

Councilmembers asked clarifying questions.

The information was received.

6.B 16-1125 Downtown Sanitation and Public Restrooms

City Manager Steve Hall gave an overview of what has been discussed regarding public restrooms including history of discussion and costs. Councilmembers asked clarifying questions.

Councilmembers discussed the issue and asked clarifying questions. Mayor Selby noted, for the record, she supports Downtown public restrooms, but cannot support this expense at this time.

Councilmember Cooper moved, seconded by Councilmember Gilman, to direct staff to move forward with the design and engineering for a restroom at the Artesian Commons and to bring back a timeline and scope of work for the remaining action items related to public restrooms.
