



Opioid Response

Overdose Statistics

An estimated 2,703 Washingtonians were lost to overdose in 2022, a 19% increase over the prior year.

OFD Response

2023

- Total opioid related encounters: 488
- Total patients treated with Naloxone: 199
- Patients with suspected opioid overdose:
 - 33% at least one dose of Naxolone
 - 67% received more than one dose
- A larger percentage of Olympia patients are requiring more than one dose of naloxone (67%) as compared to the nationwide percentage (56%).

OPD Response

From July 2, 2023 - July 1, 2024

- There were 130 drug related deaths in Thurston County, 44 of which occurred in Olympia
- The common drug combination being fentanyl and methamphetamine.
- The Olympia Police Department applied Narcan to 19 different subjects, with most incidents requiring more than one dose
- 180 with persons whose underlying issues were substance abuse related.
- Familiar Faces and Community Response Unit staff routinely help community members navigate sobriety and facilitate transportation to recovery treatment and Narcotics Anonymous meeting.

Settlements

- The City of Olympia, along with Thurston County, and the cities of Lacey and Tumwater are participating in the Opioid Abatement Council, which coordinates the distribution of funds awarded in the recent Opioid settlement.
- As of July 30, 2024, the City of Olympia has received \$762,042.24 in settlement funds.
- There is still at least one settlement pending; the settlement amount will increase once finalized.
- The settlements will continue to pay annual amounts to Olympia and the other jurisdictions for ten years.
