PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE: A quick guide for the BPAC

Guiding Principles

Every member has an equal voice. The group is the final authority. It's ok to disagree.

DISCUSSIONS	 No one speaks twice until everyone has had a chance to speak once Members must be recognized by chair before speaking Members address the chair, not each other Members may address presenters directly once recognized by the chair
MOTIONS	 Anyone can make a motion at any time after the chair has recognized them to speak Chair repeats the motion Anyone can second the motion – don't need to wait for chair's recognition If no second, motion doesn't proceed Motion gets discussed, if needed Motion can be amended Members discuss and vote on any amendments Chair repeats motion with amendment
VOTING	 When discussion wanes Chair clearly states motion and any amendments Vote by roll call "Committee Member Montoya?" "Aye" or "no" Chair states results of vote "The ayes have it and the motion passes" "The noes have it and the motion fails"
