- WHEREAS, in 1988, the observance expanded to a monthlong celebration from September 15 through October 15, coinciding with independence day celebrations of various Latin American nations; and
- WHEREAS, the histories of many Hispanic and Latinx people are intricately linked to indigenous cultures of the Americas, as well as diverse ancestries including African, Spanish, and Caribbean roots; and
- WHEREAS, the Hispanic and Latinx population has grown significantly, constituting the largest racial or ethnic minority in the United States and steadily increasing in Thurston County; and
- WHEREAS, Hispanic and Latinx communities significantly contribute to Olympia's diverse tapestry and have profoundly shaped American society through achievements in arts, government, agriculture, education, civil rights, science, technology, and innovation; and
- WHEREAS, despite these invaluable contributions, Hispanic and Latinx communities nationwide and within Olympia continue to face harmful legislative efforts, discrimination, and systemic injustice targeting their identities, livelihoods, and rights; and
- WHEREAS, Olympia proudly stands as a Sanctuary City committed to protecting the safety, dignity, and human rights of all individuals regardless of immigration status; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Olympia reaffirms its dedication to policies and practices that protect accessibility to City services and foster inclusivity, equity, and belonging; recognizing that the safety and well-being of Hispanic and Latinx communities are vital to our city's strength; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Olympia is honored to partner in community celebrations, including Lula Fest, which boldly affirms Hispanic and Latinx heritage, representation, and visibility at a critical time of civil uprising, combating efforts to minimize and erase Latinx voices, fostering unity, collective strength, resilience, and community healing; and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Olympia City Council hereby proclaims September 15 through October 15, 2025, as
