## **PROCLAMATION**

- WHEREAS, the City of Olympia recognizes the Squaxin Island Tribe has a direct lineage as the original inhabitants of the stočas (Steh-Chass), also known as Budd Inlet; and
- WHEREAS, Squaxin people have resided in stočas (Steh-Chass) since the recession of the glacier at the last Ice Age some 14,000 years ago; and
- WHEREAS, Squaxin continues a cultural legacy as "People of the Water", because of the bounty of the region's maritime waterways, artesian, river and creek waters, which have sustained the people for millennia; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Olympia honors and acknowledges the stocas (Steh-Chass) people who have stewarded this land since time immemorial and who continue to inhabit the area today; and
- WHEREAS, both the Squaxin Island Tribe and City of Olympia honor the Medicine Creek Treaty and have established a strong government-to-government relationship between the two sovereigns; and
- WHEREAS, the Festival of stocas (Steh-Chass) on August 17, 2024, is a day to recognize and celebrate the local heritage, culture, and history while honoring past, current and future generations; and
- WHEREAS, both the Squaxin Island Tribe and City of Olympia honor the 50th anniversary of Judge Boldt during the Festival of stocas (Steh-Chass); and
- WHEREAS, the City of Olympia holds an accord with the Squaxin Island Tribe, which includes an action to the dam removal, the coordination and cooperation to protect shared natural resources, and protection to salmon resources; and
- WHEREAS, both the Squaxin Island Tribe and City of Olympia will work in collaboration to strengthen our stewardship of the Salish Sea, building a stronger culture in support of water quality and salmon recovery; and
- WHEREAS, concluding the Festival of stocas (Steh-Chass) for all to participate as witnesses will be The Healing of the Waters Ceremony, focused on the importance of the gift of springs, rivers, streams, lakes and maritime waters; and
- WHEREAS, The Squaxin Island Tribe carries a large responsibility to protect and sustain our natural world. The ceremony will symbolize the connectiveness to land, water, and people; and
