#### Review of the Critical Incident

- December 29, 2022
  - 10:30 a.m. TCSO Civil Division responded to 7108 Desperado Drive in Tumwater to attempt service of a civil eviction.
  - Occupant failed to communicate with deputies.
  - Front door was forced open; the entry way was heavily barricaded.
  - Occupant refused to exit the residence and repeatedly concealed his hands.
  - Improvised explosive device (IED) located at the rear of the residence.

#### Review of the Critical Incident -SWAT

- The Thurston County SWAT Team and the WSP Bomb Squad were activated due to the increased risk to public safety
- Composition of the Thurston County SWAT Team:
  - Thurston County Sheriff's Office Deputies
  - Olympia Police Department Officers
  - Tumwater Police Department Officers
  - Lacey Police Department Officers
  - Yelm Police Department Officers
  - Medic One Medic
  - Providence Heath Physician

# Review of the Critical Incident cont.

- At approximately 1:26 p.m. the occupant fired multiple rounds from inside the residence at SWAT members who were outside.
- Over the next 8 hours and 16 minutes, the occupant repeatedly fired at SWAT members and some SWAT members returned fire.
- One OPD Officer fired at the occupant. The OPD Officer's rounds did not strike the occupant.
- After approximately 11 hours and 12 minutes, the occupant surrendered.

#### Review of Internal Review Process

- Per OPD policy, a Use of Force Review Board was convened to investigate the circumstances surrounding the use of force incident.
- Composition of the Use of Force Review Board:
  - Lieutenant in the involved member's chain of command
  - Training Sergeant
  - Patrol Sergeant
  - Officer selected by the involved officer
  - Sworn Peace Officer from an outside law enforcement agency
  - Department instructor for the type of weapon, devise, or technique used.
  - Community member

### Responsibilities of the UOF Review Board

- Review the circumstances surrounding any use of force.
- Determine if the officer's actions were within department policy and training or outside of department policy and training.
- Recommend changes to policy and/or training.

Add the following prompt to OPD operations planning and risk assessment documents:
