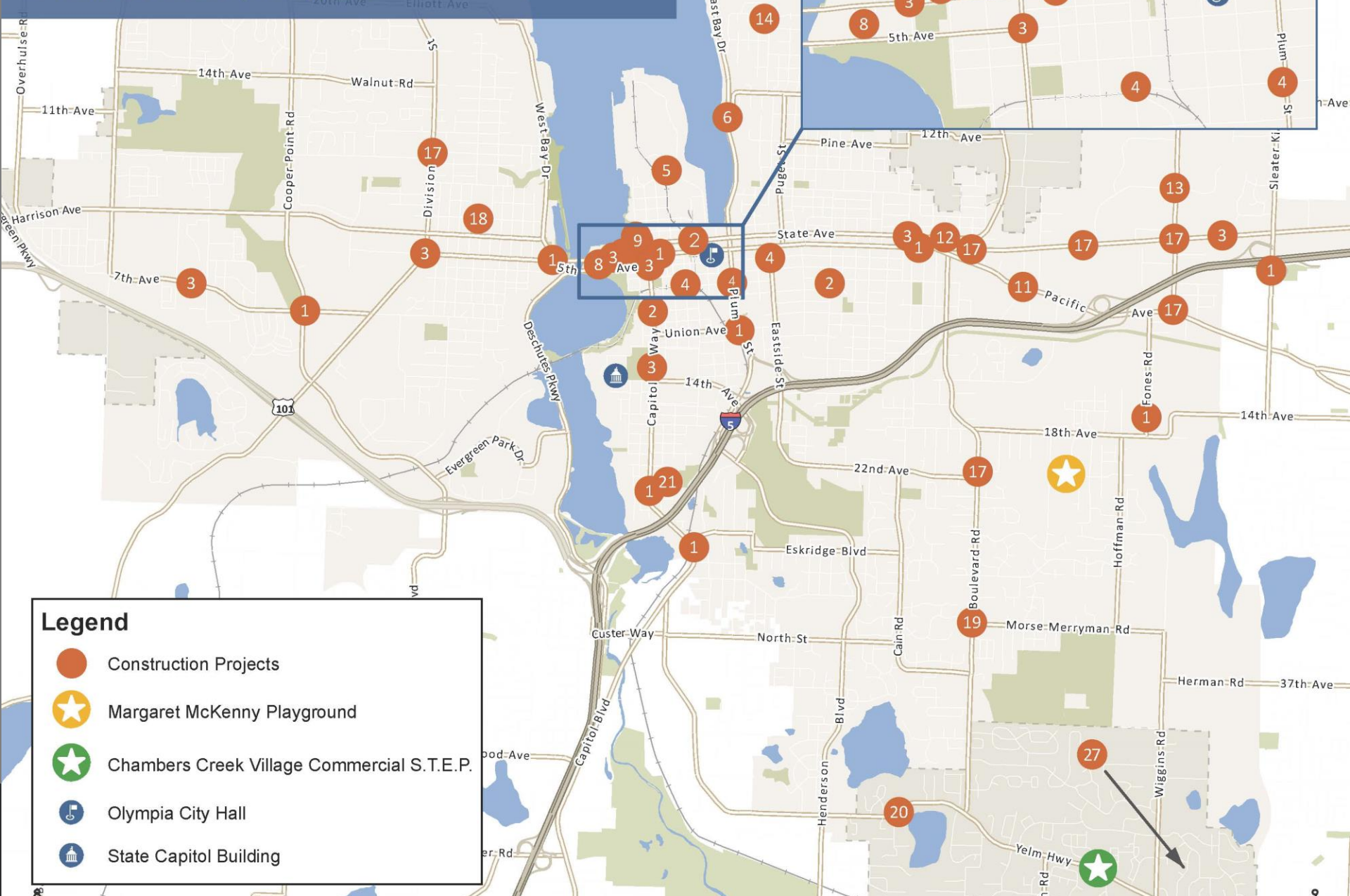

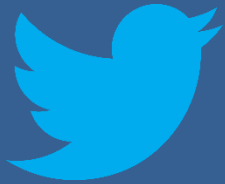

**2018 Construction Season**



This year, the Olympia City Council is investing nearly \$30 million to fund a variety of projects throughout the City. This investment in our infrastructure is split between maintaining existing and building new. With 18 City-owned facilities, 47 parks, 23 miles of trails, 7 bridges, over 520 lane miles of streets, approximately 200 miles each of trails, 7 bridges, over 520 lane miles of streets, numerous reservoirs, pump stations and lift stations, it is imperative that we invest in maintaining these critical facilities and systems. It is also imperative that we create the capacity in our systems to meet the demands of our citizens, now and into the future. Ensuring these systems provide the capacity and are in excellent working order allows our citizens to enjoy their daily lives without a second thought.

Our facilities, parks, drinking water, stormwater, sewer, and water systems are the foundation of our community. We are committed to ensuring the well-maintained and highly functioning infrastructure that is vital for a healthy environment, a thriving economy, and a strong community.
