

Rail-to-trails projects had become lightning rods for value conflict, and the decision by the Parks and Recreation Commission to go forward with this one was made in the face of 200 opponents at a public meeting and threats of legal challenge and violence. I formulated a master planning approach that eventually included 17 advisory committee meetings and three public meetings - all of which I facilitated. The immediate result was successful permitting of the first phase of the trail with no adverse public testimony. Since then over 32 miles of the rail-trail are open and enjoyed by the public.

## INITIATED IDEA FOR AN INTEGRATED LAND CLASSIFICATION AND PARK MANAGEMENT PLANNING SYSTEM, NOW ESTABLISHED AS CORE AGENCY FUNCTION, 1995 - PRESENT.

Building on results from the Mt. Spokane experience mentioned above, I worked with senior management to completely revise the agency's land classification system, and then tie implementation of that system into a long-sought goal to produce management plans for each park in the system. To date, over ninety of the most complex and important parks of the system have gone through this now nationally-recognized state parks land use planning and management model known by the acronym CAMP (Classification and Management Planning).

#### LED A SERIES OF RELATED PROJECTS AT CAPE DISAPPOINTMENT STATE PARK, 2002 – 2006.

Projects managed for State Parks included: park master planning; NEPA and SEPA environmental impact statement processing; design and permitting of \$10 million in capital improvements including artist Maya Lin's Confluence Art Project; lease negotiations with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, U.S. Coast Guard, and U.S. Bureau of Land Management; and establishment of the Lewis and Clark National Historical Park.

## LED AGENCY FORMULATION AND LEGISLATIVE PASSAGE OF SB6034, THE STATE PARKS PARTNERSHIP BILL OF 2014.

Faced with unprecedented demands to raise earned revenue and simultaneously stay true to the agency mission during the Great Recession, SB6034 was the broadest change in State Parks enabling legislation in over 30 years. It transformed the language and intent of natural and cultural resource interpretation; added promotion of artistic expression as a core agency function; established processes and standards for advertising in parks and on the internet; extended the functions of and set appropriate standards for partnerships; limited authority to name parks after corporations or businesses, and broadened the authority of the state parks foundation to financially assist the agency.
