A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLYMPIA, WASHINGTON, APPROVING A MUNICIPAL SERVICES CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF OLYMPIA AND PACIFIC MOUNTAIN WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR THE JOURNEY2JOBS PROJECT

WHEREAS, the City of Olympia has found that the circumstances of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic have significant public health and safety issues for the City of Olympia and its residents and citizens, which require further action to mitigate the risks and threat to public health and safety and the City's economy caused by such pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the Journey2Jobs (J2J) project builds upon the City's One Community Plan response to homelessness. It is designed to inspire hope, offer real opportunities for work experience and skill gain, engender community support by demonstrating commitment by unhoused neighbors to assume responsibility for their environment, and invest in their community. To ensure engagement and "buy-in" from our unhoused community residents, early engagement of the residents will help shape program elements and facilitate ownership of the J2J initiative; and

WHEREAS, Pacific Mountain Workforce Development Council (PacMtn) will work with agencies that provide services to unhoused youth and adults where the unhoused residents live, the Quince Street Village site, Drexel House, Plum Street Village, and homeless youth shelters such as Rosie's Place. The goal is to provide residents an opportunity to engage their community while building skills and confidence and contributing to the unhoused residents' communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE OLYMPIA CITY COUNCIL DOES HEREBY RESOLVE as follows:

- 1. The Olympia City Council hereby approves the form of Municipal Services Contract between the City of Olympia and Pacific Mountain Workforce Development Council for the Journey2Jobs Project and the terms and conditions contained therein.
- 2. The City Manager is authorized and directed to execute on behalf of the City of Olympia the Municipal Services Contract, and any other documents necessary to execute said Contract, and to make any amendments or minor modifications as may be required and are consistent with the intent of the Contract, or to correct any scrivener's errors.
