The Olympia Heritage Register recognizes properties that are at least 50 years old (or of lesser age if of exceptional importance), and which are important for one or more of the following reasons: (Check as many as apply.)

- Historical Importance.** The property is: the site of an historic event with an effect upon society; identified with a person or group who had some influence on society; or exemplifies the cultural, social, religious, economic, political, aesthetic or engineering history of the city.
- Architectural Importance.** The property is: (1) an individual building that embodies those distinguishing characteristics of an architectural type, period, style or method of design or construction; is the work of an architect or master builder whose individual work has influenced the development of the city; or (2) a group of buildings that may lack distinction individually, but together are easily distinguished as a unit and characterize an earlier era, way of living, and construction of the built environment.
- Archaeological Importance.** The property has yielded, or may be likely to yield archaeological information important in pre-history or history.
- Birthplaces, Graves, Cemeteries.** The property is: a birthplace or grave of a person of outstanding historical importance, or a cemetery significant because of its age, distinctive design features or association with historic events or cultural patterns.

Historic properties must also have "integrity," that is, they have not undergone changes which substantially affect their historic appearance.
