

Six Year Transportation Improvement Program Summary 2015 - 2020

The City is required by State law to prepare a six-year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and submit it to the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT). City staff updates the TIP annually to reflect the City's most recent Capital Facilities Plan (CFP). Projects need to be identified in the TIP before cities can receive state and federal funding. The following includes a list of the current TIP projects. For more detailed information please refer to the complete 2014-2019 Capital Facilities Plan.
