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

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

1	Arts	Jen Burbidge, Lacey Parks	Pg 16	The only suggested change I have would be on Page 16 under Arts and Events, first paragraph, last sentence: Because there are no other municipal programs of this type in neighboring jurisdictions, the City's programs benefit the arts regionally, while serving as a model for communities throughout Washington State. I recommend changing it to: Because there are no other municipal Arts Commissions in neighboring jurisdictions, the City's programs benefit the arts regionally, while serving as a model for communities throughout Washington State. While Lacey doesn't have an Arts Commission, or Arts Walk event/s, we do PR12.2 (Pg. 4), this Policy addresses maintaining and supporting Olympia's street trees. The City and PSE have worked together for years on implementing efforts to further "Right Tree/Right Place" policies as well as the location of both overhead and underground utility facilities in the right-of-way. We look forward to our continued partnership working on these issues including implementing development regulations for street trees.	Made change as requested: "Because there are no other municipal Arts Commissions in neighboring jurisdictions, the City's programs benefit the arts regionally, while serving as a model for communities throughout Washington State."
2	Trees	Sara Wattenberg, PSE	Pg 4	Page 6, the Chapter refers to a "Demand for new parks & arts" specifically mentioning the Armory. While not a comprehensive plan matter, PSE would like to extend its continued support for implementing energy efficiency measures at the City's Armory facility.	"native" vegetation and trees is not referring to Street Trees. We are 100% supportive of "right tree/ right place" policy for street trees and the built environment. I will clarify this in the goal. Thank you.
3	Armory	Sara Wattenberg, PSE	Pg 6	Page 6, the Chapter refers to "Climate change impacts & actions" mentioning tree canopy and tree inventory. This is another policy where "Right Tree/Right Place" comes into play. We look forward to working with the City on implementing climate change strategies and actions, including those around vegetation management.	Great! Thank you.
4	Trees	Sara Wattenberg, PSE	Pg 6	Page 7, the Chapter refers to the "Capital Facilities Plan" specifically mentioning a 2% private utility tax to help fund parks. Is this a new or an existing utility tax? The Chapter does not outline how and which private utilities will be assessed this tax. Currently, PSE collects (as a direct pass through to the City) utility taxes from its electric and natural gas customers in the City. Both of these energy tax rates are established by City.	Existing utility tax. I believe it is from a variety of utilities including cable and phones. We have a voted utility tax for sidewalks and parks and a non-voted one.
5	Utility Tax	Sara Wattenberg, PSE	Pg 7	Pages 8, 9 & 11, there are several references to the City's development and redevelopment of community parks and open space facilities. Since these sites will have or already have parking facilities, PSE is interested in working with the City's on any planned proposed electric vehicle infrastructure improvements.	Absolutely! We are designing our Yelm Highway Community Park to have several EV charging stations. Will share this with our Planning Manager.
6	EV Parking Infrastructure	Sara Wattenberg, PSE	Pg 8,9, 11	• PR4.2 (Page 12), the Policy refers to the use of existing unopened ROW, alleyways, railways, streams, and utility for trails/recreation. It is unclear if this includes PSE's electric transmission line corridors that are typically located through easement. It will be important to establish measures to ensure both the facility and the public's safety along these trail corridors.	Absolutely. Thank you.
7	ROW	Sara Wattenberg, PSE	Pg 12	GR5 (Page 13), the Goal does not specifically address parking for new development and redevelopment around urban waterfront area, perhaps this is addressed elsewhere such as the City's Parking Strategy. As mentioned above, PSE is desirous of working with the City on its implementation of transportation electrification measures.	This level of detail is in the development codes and often in the Master Planning or design documents rather than the Comp Plan. Electricification is a high priority for the City.
8	EV Parking Infrastructure	Sara Wattenberg, PSE	Pg 13		

9	Project Planning	Sara Wattenberg, PSE	Pg 13	PR6.4 (Page 13), the Policy refers to a regional approach to future major recreation facilities. Such major recreation facilities generally have larger impact to electric and natural facilities. We encourage working with PSE on future master plans for these proposed sites.	Thank you. 10	Armory	Sara Wattenberg, PSE	Pg 14	Page 14, the Chapter refers to "Developing Arts Center" such as the Armory. As mentioned above, we encourage the City to work with PSE on implementing energy efficient measures for this site.	Great! Thank you.




