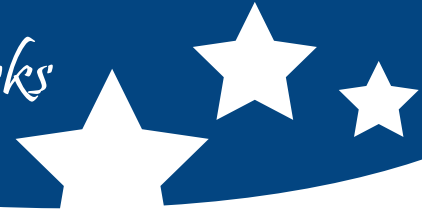


A Friendly Reminder About Fireworks



The cities of Lacey and Olympia remind residents and visitors that the sale and discharge of **consumer fireworks are not allowed** in either community. Novelty devices such as snakes, glowworms, and party poppers are permitted; however sparklers and all other types of fireworks are not. Fireworks purchased elsewhere, such as at tribal stands or fireworks sales booths in other communities, may not be used in Lacey or Olympia.

Voter Approved

A majority of voters in both communities approved propositions for the ban on consumer fireworks. The ordinances may be viewed on each city's websites. Residents and visitors celebrating the Independence Day holiday are urged to do so in a safe and enjoyable manner that is within the law. With everyone's cooperation, our residents and pets will be safe, and our fire and police responders can focus on non-fireworks emergencies.

Firework Displays

Permits may be obtained for professionally operated public fireworks displays. This year there will be public displays in Lacey on July 3, Tumwater on July 4, and at Lakefair in Olympia on July 21.
