Commissioners discussed broadening the Municipal Art Plan to be a comprehensive document that describes the goals and purposes of the Arts Commission, in addition to providing an expenditure sheet of proposed projects. Stacy and Marygrace have been tasked with framing the document based on the attached outline. Commissioners agreed to a preliminary set of public art project to be included with the Municipal Art Plan, many of which are already on the work plan.

The discussion was continued to the Arts Commission due back on 10/16/2014

14-0850 Percival Plinth Project Peoples' Choice Award 2014

Stephanie shared the results of the vote with Commissioners, noting that voters felt there were many good pieces to choose from this year. The period of voting lasted from July 25 (with a public kick-off)- August 31, 2014. Out of 481 votes, *Illuminated One* by Leo E. Osborne was front runner with 179. *Origami #3 Totem* by Ken Hall came in as runner up with 71 votes, and *The Night Watchman* by Leon White, held third with 45 votes. The Call for Art goes out again in January 2015, so Commissioners have time to determine if changes should be made before the next cycle. Trent thanked all the staff who worked on the vote, from printing ballots to tabulation.

The recommendation was completed.
