

BRIEF HISTORY OF OLYMPIA CDBG PROGRAM

Federal CDBG Program Created - 1974

 Combined federal programs like "Model Cities" and "Urban Renewal Program" into a single Community Development "Block Grant" Program



Brief History of Olympia CDBG Program

- Olympia CDBG Program Created 1982
- \$12,597,572 Received to Date in Annual CDBG Grants

BRIEF HISTORY OF OLYMPIA CDBG PROGRAM

- 1982 2010 Primary use: Housing Rehabilitation
 - 400 Owner-occupied Homes Rehabilitated
 - 1,400 Tenant-occupied Homes Rehabilitated
 - Loan Repayments = Program Income




BRIEF HISTORY OF OLYMPIA CDBG PROGRAM

Purpose of CDBG:

- A federal CDBG entitlement program allocates annual grants to larger cities and urban counties to develop viable communities by providing:
 - Decent housing;
 - Suitable living environment; and,
 - Expanded economic opportunities




Principally benefits **low- and moderate-income** persons.



Federal Funds Received Each Year (PY 2013: \$357,512)


This Chart presents the City's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) annual grant awards from 2005 through 2013. The City has received \$12,597,572 in annual CDBG awards since 1982. Grant award amounts have varied over the years, starting with \$322,000 in 1982, with the lowest award of \$258,000 in 1990 and an all-time high of \$496,370 in 2009.

CDBG FUND SOURCES

CDBG Section 108 Loan Funds

- Special CDBG Program
 - Olympia eligible for loan guarantees up to \$1,756,000
 - Allocated \$325,000 (19% of total funds) for Public Facility Projects
 - \$50,000: Alleyway Lighting Project
 - \$275,000: ADA Sidewalk Access Project
