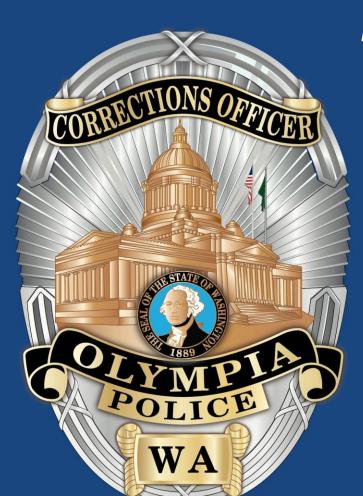

- Also releasing to Community Court

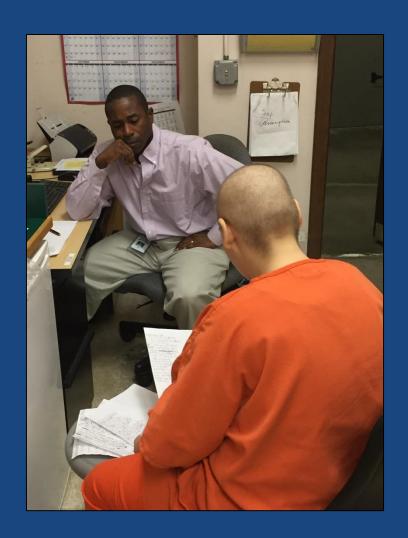
21,900 Meals Served!

668 Physicals Given | 912 Med Passes Performed





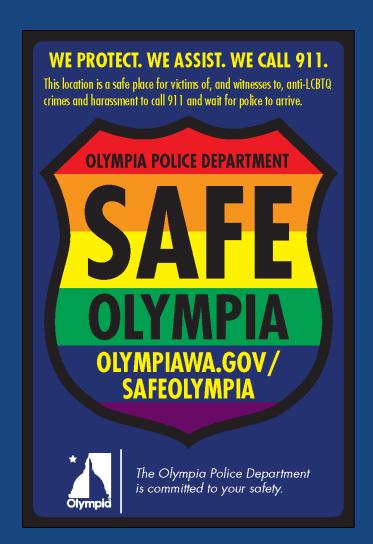
Inmates also spend time with mental health providers and church service volunteers
