6.A <u>25-0298</u> Approval of a Resolution Authorizing the Sale of City Owned Real Property Located at 900 Plum Street SE to Island Enterprises, Inc., a Wholly Owned Enterprise of the Squaxin Island Tribe, a Federally Recognized Indian Tribe

City Manager Jay Burney shared background on the Tribal Accord, the property of 900 Plum Street SE, and an overview of the purchase and sale agreement for the sale of the property.

Squaxin Island Tribal Chairman Kris Peters spoke to the sale of the property and future project that will be on the property.
