Approval of a Resolution Directing Staff to Negotiate an Interlocal Agreement with Thurston County for Judicial, Jail Alternatives, and Supervised Probation Services

Assistant City Manager Debbie Sullivan shared the background on the City's Municipal Court. She presented options for the relocation of the court, the staff recommended option and next steps.
