Ordinance to Address Code Barriers to Farming

Recommended Code Changes in proposed ordinance:

- Allow small-scale growing and harvesting of food crops in downtown zoning districts (UW; UW-H; DB) – p. 29
- Allow small-scale growing and harvesting of food crops in high density residential zoning districts (RM-24, RMH, RMU, UR) – p. 7
- Add Section 18.04.060.kk p. 10



Ordinance to Address Code Barriers to Farming

KK. AGRICULTURE.

In the RM-24, RMH, RMU, UR, UW, UW-H and DB zoning districts, agriculture is limited to the small-scale growing and harvesting of food crops or non-food crops (e.g., flowers) for personal or group consumption, for donation, or for sale that is incidental in nature and where no nuisance is created by such use. This includes community gardens managed and maintained by a group of individuals or a public or not-for profit organization or association; rooftop gardens; vertical agriculture on exterior walls of a building; and hydroponics or other indoor growing methods that are small-scale and accessory to the primary use of the property.
