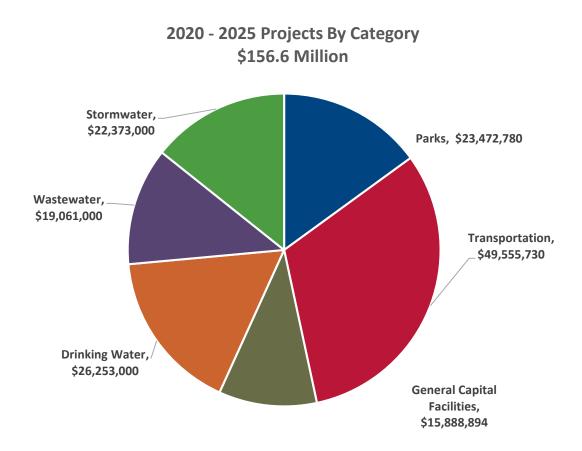

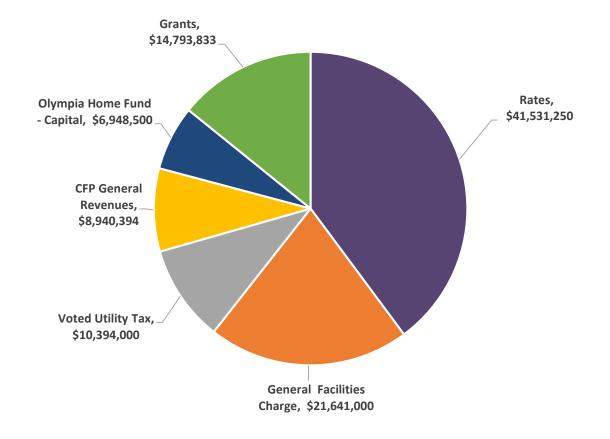

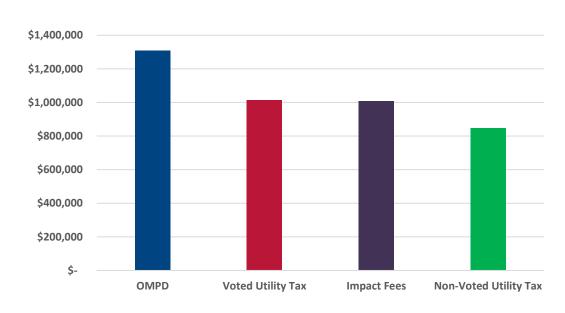
2020-2025 Financial Plan - \$156.6 Million

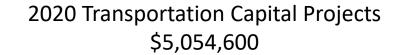

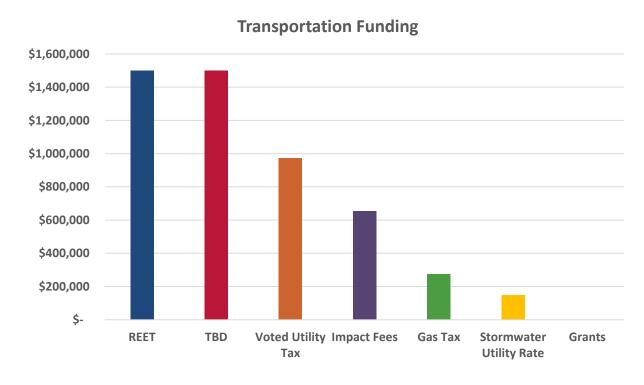

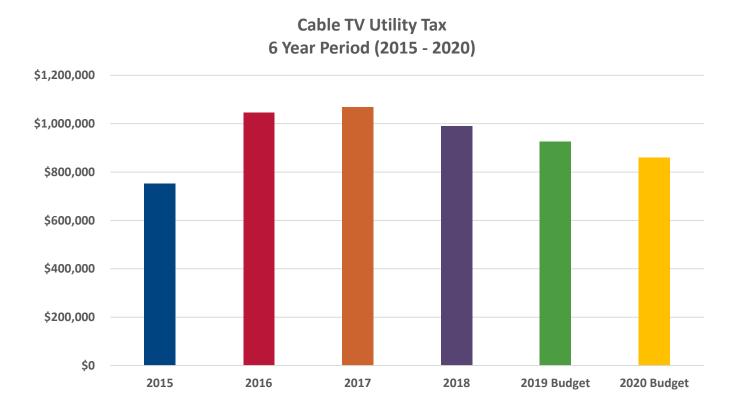

2020 General Capital Facilities Projects \$2,601,500

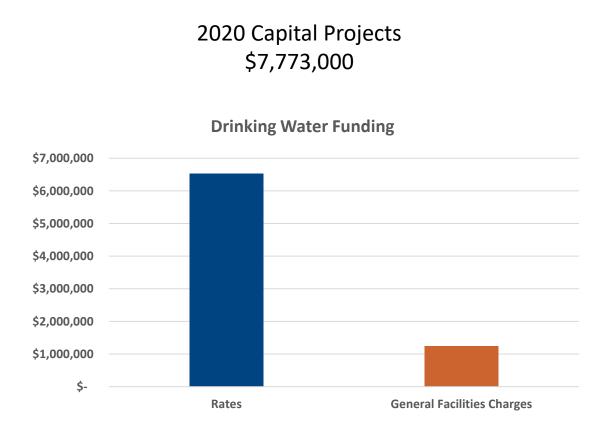


- Fund grant program for permanent supportive housing

Declining Cable TV Tax Revenue



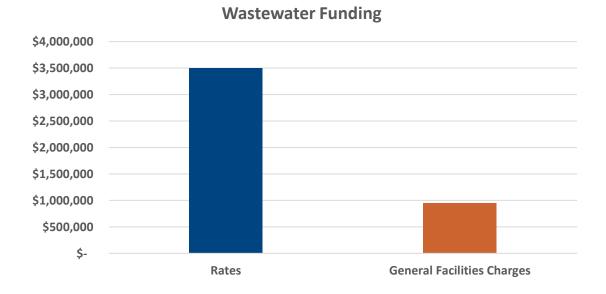
Drinking Water: Capital Projects & Funding Sources



- Conducting an Olympia Brewery
 Water Source Engineering Analysis
- Seismically retrofitting Elliot, Fir Street and Boulevard Road Reservoirs.
- Replace aging water pipes

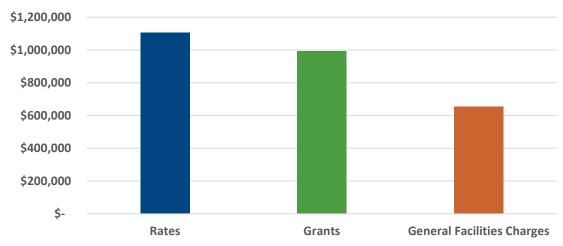


- Upgrade Miller & Central and Old Port lift stations
