CHARTERING AUTHORITY	Authority The Ad Hoc Committee, including the members, was authorized on September 29, 2020 by the City Council.

GOALS	<ul> <li>Eliminate inequities, bias, and racial injustice within the public safety system.</li> <li>Increase the City Council's knowledge of the City's current public safety system and changes implemented since the citizen Ad Hoc Committee on Police Relations.</li> <li>Increase understanding of existing federal, state, and local policies and codes and how it how it impacts the City's public safety system.</li> <li>Increase the City Council's understanding and use of data in public safety policy discussions and decision-making.</li> <li>Increase Council's understanding and agreement on those areas in which the Council has control and those areas in which the Council has influence.</li> <li>Increase partner investment (County Prosecution, Jail, etc.) and citizen involvement in the public engagement process on 'Reimagining Public Safety'</li> </ul>
