WHEREAS, this levy would authorize the Olympia School District to continue a four-year technology and capital projects levy to support increased student access to technology, preparing students for college and careers now and into the future, and fund districtwide safety improvement projects; and

WHEREAS, public education is a critical cornerstone of building a sense of community and maintaining a high quality of life in Olympia, as well as preparing the next generation to be responsible community members; and

WHEREAS, the Olympia School District has shown responsible management and strong leadership in the use of public funds; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes this levy is important to maintaining the high quality of education in the Olympia School District; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with RCW 42.17A.555(1), the opportunity for members of the public to express an approximately equal opportunity for the expression of an opposing view has been afforded by the City Council prior to taking action on this Resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE OLYMPIA CITY COUNCIL DOES HEREBY RESOLVE that it supports the Olympia School District No. 111's Technology and Capital Projects Replacement Levy, Proposition No. 1, to be presented to the electorate on February 8, 2022.
