Suiding Principles Several Sev

Every member has an equal voice. The group is the final authority. It is ok to disagree.

Discussions

- No one speaks twice until everyone has had a chance to speak once
- Members must be recognized by the chair before speaking Members address the chair, not each other
- Members may address presenters directly once recognized by the chair

Motions

- Anyone can make a motion at any time after the chair has recognized them to speak
 - \sim Chair repeats the motion
- Anyone can second the motion—don't need to wait for chair's recognition
 - \sim If there is no second, the motion doesn't proceed
- Motion gets discussed, if needed
- Motion can be amended
 - ~ Members discuss and vote on any amendments

~ Chair repeats motion as amended

Voting

- When discussion wanes
- Chair clearly states motion (as amended, if it was)
- Vote
 - \sim "All in favor, say aye"
 - ~ "All opposed, say no"
- Chair states results of vote
 - \sim "The ayes have it and the motion passes"
 - ~ "The noes have it and the motion fails"
