Subject: Recommended 5 year Pipeline Capital Project Plan

Dear CIP Members:

Over the past two years the Housing Action Team of Thurston Thrives has been working collaboratively to come up with a 5 year Capital Project Pipeline Plan. The purpose of this plan is to clearly layout Capital projects designed to provide much needed affordable housing in Thurston County. Because of the complexity of putting together a community project, the process can take 2-4 years from concept to completion. The complex layers of funding, site control, project design, and permitting necessary to complete an affordable housing community is extensive and takes countless hours to complete. This plan allows the affordable housing community providers to effectively plan on CIP/Thurston County funding as the seed money to complete this complex process.

After many meetings throughout the past two years the Housing Action Team and its stakeholder members are pleased to present this plan which has received 100% consensus support. We believe in successful program outcomes and readiness of projects. This Pipeline plan provides for both outcomes and project readiness. The following outcomes will successfully be delivered through this plan. We are recommending to the CIP the following proposal:

1. This 5 year pipeline plan will produce approximately 172 new units of affordable housing in Thurston County

2. 50% (at a minimum) of these units are planned for permanent supportive housing meaning housing plus necessary services for extremely vulnerable families and individuals including the mentally ill, developmentally disabled, and homeless populations. Remaining units are targeting work force housing for income levels at or below 50% of median family income who are one paycheck away from homelessness. This provides mixed-income housing developments throughout the county.

3. Considering the average cost per unit of these projects is \$184,000, the approximate allocation of HOME and 2160 funds totaling \$3.5 million dollars over the next 5 years will leverage an additional \$28 million in funding in Thurston County to bring these new units on-line.

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4. The pipeline allows agencies a higher level of confidence to secure the additional sources of funding necessary to complete these projects.

5. This 5 year pipeline allows a look-ahead for the CIP, HAT, policy makers, and service providers.
