

What is the Action Plan?


The Action Plan is our "road map" for moving our Comprehensive Plan vision forward with a set of indicators to track and report on progress.




Annual Update Cycle

- Repeatable; appropriate scope




Annual Update Cycle

Possible Reasons for Changes

- Council goals/priorities
- City staff:
 - Updated plans
 - Completed work
 - Process improvements, etc.
- Partner engagement/collaboration
- Community member input

Planning Commission

Recommendation

Commissioner Ehlers moved, seconded by Commissioner Hoppe, to recommend to City Council approval of the draft updates to the Action Plan as recommended by staff.

The motion was unanimously approved.

Proposed Changes

Overview

- •Minimal—fewer proposed changes this year
- Changes to actions only
- Proposed changes include:
 - 7 new actions
 - 7 removed actions
 - 16 revised actions

New Actions


7 new actions are proposed

Sources

- Downtown Strategy
- ■Parks, Arts & Recreation Plan

Action Criteria

- •What makes an action?
- Using already established criteria



Removed Actions

7 actions are proposed to be removed

Reasons

- ■6 = completed.
- ■1 = integrated into another action during the Downtown Strategy process.

Revised Actions

16 actions are proposed to be revised

Reasons

- Change from "new" action to "ongoing" action
- Clarify and/or correct language
- •Align language with an existing/new Plan, like the Downtown Strategy

Council Action

Options

- Approve the updates to the Action Plan as proposed.
- Direct staff to work on specific changes to the Action Plan and bring back to City Council for additional consideration.

Next Steps

June-December 2017

- Online survey data (early learning & sheltering)
 - Survey analysis
 - Share findings; seek Council direction
- ■Partner engagement—interviews & community conversation
 - Early learning—share findings; seek Council direction
 - Emergency sheltering—support AHCOAH

- Community survey for indicator data (Elway)
- Public Works pilot—completion & sharing
- Interdepartmental team—charter, work plan
- Action Plan framework—continuous improvement
 - Action criteria
 - Indicator dashboard
