Statement of Significance Located on the southeast side of Olympia in the Governor Stevens Neighborhood, the Hamley House was first occupied by Frederick G. Hamley, his wife Marjorie E. (formerly Ms. Wood) and their two daughters Arlene and June. The family resided there from 1949-1956. The Hamley House is of local historical significance as Mr. Hamley was a former Seattle City Council member, personal legal advisor to Washington Governor Langlie, and member of the Washington State Supreme Court from 1949-1956, serving as Chief Justice for the last two years. He also served on numerous high profiles committees and was appointed by President Eisenhower to the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco in 1956. Mr. Hamley also founded the Olympia Unitarian Fellowship, a local branch of the international Unitarian faith and helped to create public television station KCTS

Description of Physical Appearance The house is a good example of a minimal traditional style home, and includes a corner window in the International style, glass block in Deco style, and a prominent brick chimney. There have been no significant remodels. The chimney, windows and siding are original and in their original location. Plaster on chimney is not original
