I. Olympia Planning Commission's Role and Authority

The Olympia Planning Commission (OPC) was formed in 1935 to advise the City Council on the long range growth and development of Olympia, including changes to the City's land use regulations. The Planning Commission is authorized and empowered to act as the research and fact-finding agency of the City. To that end, it may make surveys, provide analysis, undertake research, and make reports as generally authorized or requested by the City Council. The Planning Commission, upon such request or pursuant to such authority, may:

- A. Make inquiries, perform investigations and surveys concerning the resources of the City;
- B. Assemble and analyze any data obtained and formulate plans for the conservation of such resources and the systematic utilization and development thereof;
- C. Make recommendations from time to time as to the best methods of such conservation; utilization and development; and
- D. Cooperate with other public agencies in such planning conservation and development.
