Veteran Population

- 2,240 of Thurston County's Veterans live below poverty level
- 7,628 Thurston County Veterans have a service-related disability
- 290,000 working-age Veterans in Washington State are unemployed or underemployed
- 23% of the suicide victim in Washington are Veterans
- About 50% of all Veterans in the U.S.
 never access their earned VA benefits





Lacey Has Allocated

- \$90,000 seed money in 2016
- \$125,000 for 2017

Thurston County Has Allocated

- \$30,000 for 2017
- \$30,000 for 2018

The City is also working with Federal Department of Veterans Affairs and neighboring jurisdictions regarding potential partnerships and funding contributions.



Mayor's Gala
