Dear Cari, It is wonderful that that the SPSCC Health and Wellness Building 33 Expansion is planned to further support students and community.

However, the plan in its entirety appears short sighted. I live adjacent to the college in Percival Creek Subdivision and for years have noticed that parking for the college is not adequate. This year has been the worst with more cars parking in our subdivision. One vehicle parks close to our stop sign at Monterey and Mottman Rd which interferes with ingress and egress. Students also park in the subdivision next to us and up and down RW Johnson on both sides of the road. In addition the footpath along Mottman Road students walk down is not safe. There are transfer truck tire prints next to the narrow path where trucks have crept off the side of the road and up against narrow path. The path is very close to the side of the road. Unsafe situation for students or anyone to walk along.

Parking will only get worse and more intrusive in the areas that surround the college with the proposed plan.

This project should not be approved without a plan that provides additional parking on the community property.
