
- **Goal 2:** Increase the quantity of recyclable and compostable materials diverted from the landfill.

- **Goal 4:** Manage the Utility's finances responsibly, with fair, equitable rates that promote waste reduction and recycling.







- Slowed throughput.
- Finding markets is increasingly difficult.
- City costs continue to rise
- Commodity values at historic low.
  - Mixed paper value before +\$100/ton,
  - today -\$19/ton
  - Lowest to date -\$20/ton
- Previously, processing & hauling costs mostly offset by revenue generated from selling material.

### Net Cost to City after Commodity Values offset the Price of Transload, Hauling,& Processing




### Annual Per/Ton Net Recycling Cost '97 - Current
