1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Grisham called the meeting to order at 6:06pm.

1.A ROLL CALL

Arts Program Specialist Angel Nava was also in attendance.

2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Chair Grisham asked for a motion to approve the agenda. Ms. Johnson asked to add a public art update to Arts Program Support Reports. Commissioner McManus moved to approve the agenda as amended, seconded by Commissioner Hicks.

The agenda was approved.

6. BUSINESS ITEMS

[19-0702](#) Percival Peoples' Prize Recommendation to City Council

Ms. Nava provided an overview of the results of the 2019 Plinth Prize Peoples' Choice vote. With the addition of online voting, it turned out to be a record breaking participation year with 1,600 votes (2.5x more than the 631 received in 2018). During the voting window of June 22-July 31:

- 1,363 ballots were received online, 237 via paper ballots
- 57% or 920 people saw sculptures in person
- 53% (845) of voters were from Olympia Zip Codes
- 925 comments about the work

Honorable mention went to **Work** by Nathan Robles, with 189 votes, and **Bear Listening in a Story Place** by Nancy Thorne-Chambers with 218 votes. With 330 votes, **The Giant and I** by Nathan Robles took first place as determined by public vote.

Vice Chair Dobler moved to recommend **The Giant and I** to City Council for purchase, seconded by Commissioner McManus. The cost of the sculpture is \$9,750.

Recommendation approved for purchase of Percival Plinth sculpture and forwarded to Council for consideration.

[19-0704](#) Review of Grants to Arts Organizations application

Ms. Johnson shared draft copies of the 2020 Grants to Arts Organizations application, noting only minimal changes to the Project Review and Approval section (noting that Commissioner review would take place at the November 14 meeting). She asked Commissioners to consider requesting that applicants who have received funds wait one calendar year before applying again. This is not an uncommon practice, and would allow for more and diverse projects to be funded over the course of the project.

Commissioners discussed making the change, and agreed to do so for 2020, reserving the right to change the process again next year if needed.

2019 Grants to Arts Organizations application reviewed and changes made.

[19-0697](#) Finalizing of design details for West Bay Art Crossing

Ms. Johnson shared a packet of finalizing details from the West Bay Project artists Lin McJunkin and Milo White. She noted a few considerations that had come up this first time through the process. Regarding lighting the sculptures: as specified, the artists have planned for wiring the sculpture and installing LED lamps within. If power was available, the City would provide connection under the separate installation contract. As there is no power at part of the site, the City will provide the solar power system needed to light the sculpture from the installation budget. Regarding landscaping: The artists will provide the large rocks they anticipate in the planting plan, and the City will provide the plants that the artists will specify in their planting plan following consultation with the City's on call

landscape architect.

Commissioner McManus moved to approve the final/structural design details for the West Bay Art Crossing, seconded by Commissioner Hicks with Vice Chair Dobler abstaining due to personal difference with the asymmetry of the design.

Final/structural design details for the West Bay Art Crossing approved.
