

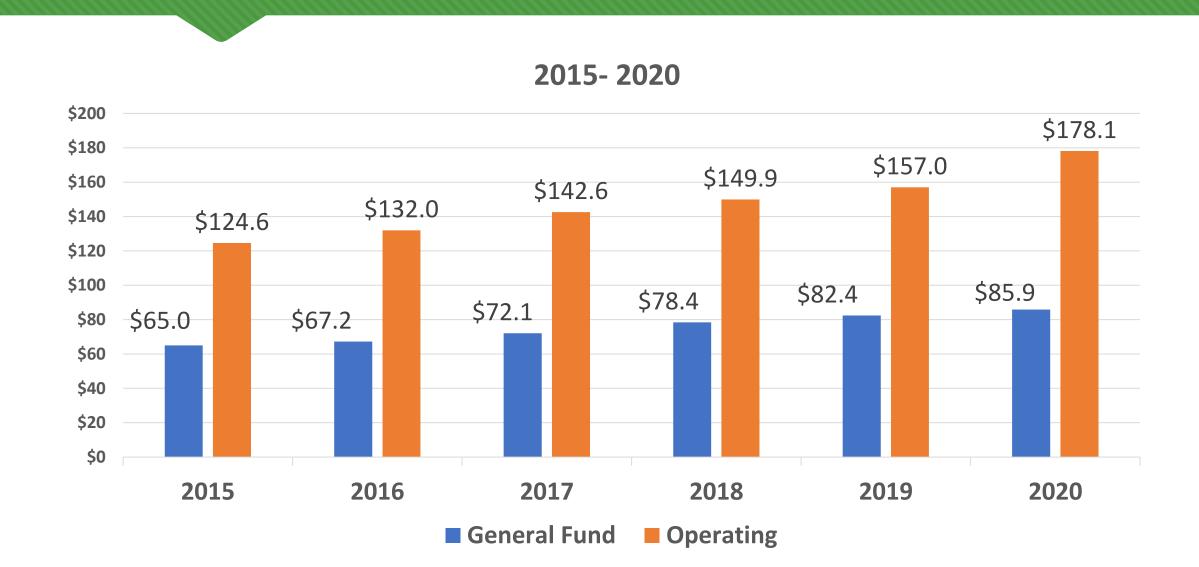

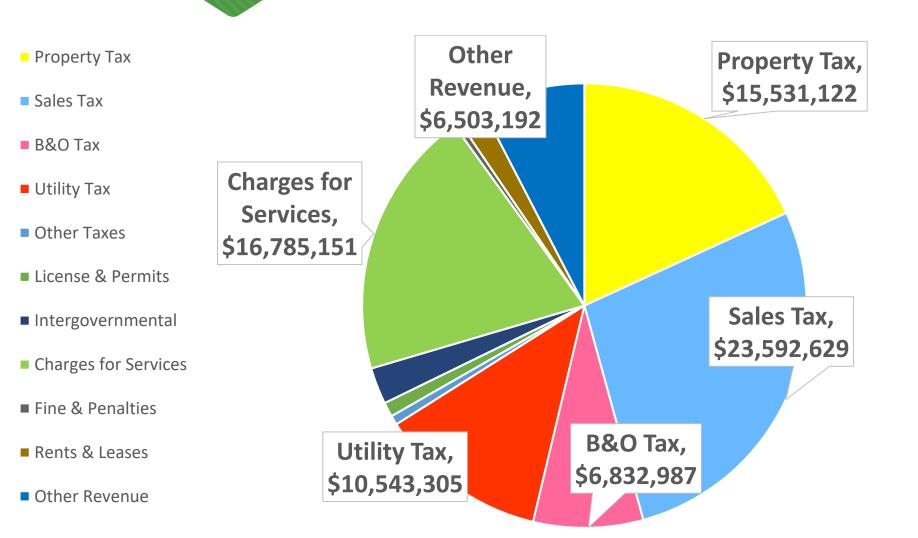

#### Tier 1 \$3 million

•	2020 Gen Fund Exp Savings	\$2,700,000
•	2019 Fund Balance	\$300,000

#### Tier 2 \$6 million

•	2020 Gen Fund Exp Savings	\$3,465,000
•	2019 Fund Balance	\$935,000
•	Budget Stabilization Reserve	\$1,600,000

#### Tier 3 \$10.5 million

•	2020 Gen Fund Exp Savings	\$4,706,000
•	2019 Fund Balance	\$935,000
•	Public Safety Reserves	\$935,000
•	Budget Stabilization Reserve	\$3,000,000
•	Voted Utility Tax	\$500,000
•	Non-Voted Utility Tax	\$424,000

### COVID-19 – Revenue Projection Challenges

- Lack of/inconsistent data
- Revenue deferrals
- Changing variables
- Unknown duration
- Behavioral changes

#### Revenue Projection Guidelines

- Be conservative
- Focus on major revenue sources
- Project revenue by month
- Consider data from multiple sources
- Make decisions based on data

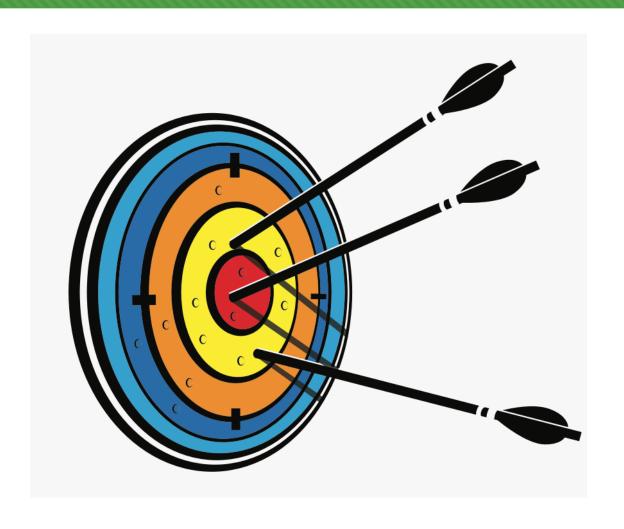

## Financial Resiliency Revenue Shortfall Response Plan – Tier "2.5"

#### Tier 2.5 - \$6.75 million

<ul> <li>2020 Gen Fund Exp Savings</li> </ul>	\$3,400,000
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- 2019 Fund Balance \$935,000
- Budget Stabilization Reserve \$1,500,000
- Voted Utility Tax \$500,000
- Non-Voted Utility Tax \$424,000

#### Continued Strategies Moving Forward

- Remain conservative on revenue projections
- Keep all expenditure reductions in place
- Continue with hiring freeze
- Continue to review Rev & Exp monthly
- If Revenues rebound reconsider use of VUT & NVUT
- Continue to evaluate 2020 going into 2021
