- ☐ Implement the Housing Action Plan
 - o Expand use of multifamily tax exemption and maximize its use for affordable housing
 - o Adopt tenant protections (includes consideration of relocation assistance)
 - Review fees/regulations to identify housing cost reductions
 - Expand parking reductions
 - o Consider including housing when developing real estate
- ☐ Develop the former Griswold's property with affordable housing
- ☐ Acquire Quince Street property for future permanent supportive housing
- ☐ Move the mitigation site out of the downtown core (relates to One Community: Healthy Housed and Safe Plan)
