6.A <u>23-0053</u> Budget Spotlight - 2024 Draft Budget Creation Calendar

23-0249 ADDED DURING THE MEETING - Recommendation for the City Council to Consider a Resolution Acknowledging Awareness of the Impacts of a Regional Fire Authority on Parks Funding

City Manager Jay Burney reported the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee and parks advocates are concerned about the ramifications on parks funding if the Regional Fire Authority (RFA) passes. Mr. Burney recommended that Council pass a resolution recognizing awareness of potential impacts to parks funding if the RFA passes a vote of the people.

Committee member Madrone moved, seconded by Committee member Cooper, to approve a recommendation for the City Council to consider a resolution acknowledging impacts to parks funding if the Regional Fire Authority passes a vote of the people. The motion carried by the following vote:
