Ms. Sadlier reported the following:

- She handed out a copy of the letter from the Commission to City Council regarding the Downtown Strategy draft recommendations for Commissioners' reference.
- Olympia has just had its first certified Federal Tax Credit rehabilitation since 2004 at 1701 4th Avenue East.
- Reminder the Certified Local Governments (CLG) training will be on March 7, 2017 at the Tacoma Convention Center.
- The City was awarded an additional \$5,000 grant from the County for the Downtown survey which brings the total grants awarded to \$23,000.
- The consultants from Artifacts (selected to do the Downtown survey) will be coming to Downtown on February 6 and 7 to do preliminary field work. She spoke to them about doing a workshop at the February 25, 2017 retreat that will be held at the Woman's Club. The consultants hope to have the survey process completed by May.

#### 8. OTHER TOPICS

Commissioner Vann announced the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) will be offering cultural resource training at the "DAHP Academy". Details are being set and will be shared shortly.

Arts Commissioner Jennings reported on a rehabilitation project for the Tivoli Fountain on the Capitol Campus. She briefly discussed other proposed projects on the Campus.
