4. STAFF ANNOUNCEMENTS

Ms. Phillips reminded the Commission of upcoming meeting dates and provided a brief update on building projects. She also informed the Commission the City's Economic Development Director, Renee Sunde resigned.

5. BUSINESS ITEMS

5.A <u>17-0891</u> Joint Meeting of the Olympia Planning Commission and the Coalition of

Neighborhood Associations

Mr. Schulte indicated the CNA needed to conduct some administrative business prior to the joint discussion. The minutes from CNA's last meeting were approved. Mr. Schulte indicated an opportunity has been presented to the CNA as a courtesy of the City of Olympia Police and Community Planning and Development Departments to have a workshop on Saturday - October 21, 2017. The workshop will be led by a specialist on neighborhood issues and will look at possible solutions to many of the issues faced by neighborhoods. He asked members if they would be interested in attending this workshop instead of having the normal CNA meeting in October. There were enough members interested so that will be their only meeting in October.

Neighborhood nuisance and crime issues

The CNA members and the Commission discussed the following:

- Dangerous Activities, including drug manufacturing and sales
- Block Watch
- Home burglaries
- · City of Olympia responsiveness
- Rentals in the CNA area comprise 40% of the homes, 96% of those owners are located out of state
- Vacant property issues, such as squatters and lack of property maintenance
- Rental housing inspections could reduce crime and code violations
- The potential to add volunteer positions in Code Enforcement, similar to the Police Department
- Missing Middle housing accessory dwelling units and current requirement for property owner to live on-site
- Code Enforcement cannot enter private property without permission
- Addressing drug addiction issues may help reduce the problems associated with addiction
- Use of Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)

Capital Facilities Plan (CFP)

The CNA members and the Commission discussed the following:

- CFP work in neighborhoods
- Sidewalks and pedestrian crossing improvements
- Parks acreage and investments
- CNA priorities
- Bike lanes
- Relationship to the Comprehensive Plan
- Investment to reduce dependence on automobiles
- Would be helpful if when making a suggestion for a CFP item to identify the source of the funds to facilitate that item
- Partnering with School District
- Should subarea plans be incorporated in the CFP?

There was also a discussion about neighborhood centers.
