THIS REVIEW IS BASED ON SITE PLAN & MATERIALS: Project application forms, the architectural packet, the civil plan set, OMC Chapters 18.100, 18.110., 18.130.

A. Site and Landscape Design: Recommend approval subject to the following condition:

1. Add landscaping/vegetation in the slope and basin in the detention pond – choose appropriate plant materials for each zone and maximize the amount of landscape to the greatest extent possible. Sedges or low-grow plants will grow in the detention pond with appropriate sub-grade soil.

B. Building Design: Recommend approval as proposed.

C. Colors and Materials: Recommend approval as proposed.

Board member Robert Findlay made a motion to approve the Washington State School Directors Association (WSSDA) design proposal, File 18-2958, subject to the condition listed above. Board member Angela Rush seconded the motion. Six (6) Board members present voted "aye", none opposed. The motion passed unanimously.
