6. OTHER BUSINESS

6.A <u>18-0163</u> 2018 Annual Comprehensive Plan Amendment Screening

Assistant Community Planning and Development Planning Director Leonard Bauer gave an overview of potential comprehensive plan amendments. The proposed amendments are:

1. Memorialize Views - A City request to memorialize views identifed as important in the Downtown Strategy.

2. Coalition of Neighborhood Association (CNA) - Four proposed text amendments, intended to expand current language regarding the City's role in Code Enforcement and crime prevention.

3. Black Lake Blvd/Highway 101 - Proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment and

Rezone (1.57 acres)

Councilmembers Gilman and Cooper asked to consider the docket without item number 2 and requested the City Manager work with staff and the CNA to find a more operational solution.
