## **Background and Analysis:**

The Capital Facilities Plan (CFP) is an annually-updated document that is used to identify funding for City capital projects on a 6-year horizon, as required by the state Growth Management Act.

The projects proposed in the draft Parks, Arts & Recreation chapter of the 2020-2025 CFP are drawn from the 2016 Parks, Arts and Recreation Plan.

# **Financial Impact:**

The draft CFP proposes \$5,390,380 in appropriations for park capital projects in 2020. The funding sources for park capital projects are: impact fees, Olympia Municipal Park District (OMPD) funds, Voted Utility Taxes (V.U.T.), and Non-Voted Utility Taxes (N.V.U.T.).
